#### Editorial

We New Zealanders have an inherited history of free range hunting on public land with the ability to own and use firearms to do this hunting.

What is the future of Firearms ownership in New Zealand, what is the future of hunting in New Zealand? I am concerned for both, the rules for firearms ownership have changed and will have further changes. It will become harder to become a licenced firearms owner, (If the info I have on recent applications to become one are true it already has become harder, with the recent changes to getting a Firearms licence numbers are down after the changes late last year.)

Any reduction in firearms ownership flows on to reduced numbers hunting (legally), it becomes harder to justify that hunting is part of being a Kiwi if not many are left hunting. It would be a shame if hunting in New Zealand as we have known it was no more. At times like this ones looks to organisations that promote and encourage this hunting. One such organisation is The NZDA. It is unfortunate that in this time of need this organisation appears to be in a bit of a crisis?

At National level a new membership programme has been introduced, with the annual membership renewals. So far it has no produced the results, our membership records appear a mess. The sending out of renewal notices has had major problems. This needs fixed yesterday or we will lose members at the very time we need more. If you have problems with your renewal ring 04 499 6163 and get it sorted. (I did after waiting over a month!) You have no insurance until you do, can't enter any competitions, and won't get newsletter once I get a current membership list. Currently we have only two paid staff in HQ who are trying to fix the mess. Perhaps we do need a paid manager, but such cost money, what's the cost of not having one though? If we bleed members!! Think of the unpaid who are currently the National Executive, how much time are they committing to your benefit.

At local branch level there is a shortage of volunteers to man the positions, (this is not an only Southland thing). But the branch has no treasurer, I hear our Executive member in charge or membership is pulling the pin at this month's AGM on this job. About half the current executive collect Govt. Super. Then I now hear that we will be in need of a new President.

Members, fellow hunters you have little choice but to stand up and be counted, if you desire to continue to hunt. As I see it the younger you are the more important that you become active to preserve hunting, you have more to lose. People like me have done most of their hunting. (We still hope to do a bit more you never know what's behind the next tree?)

Yes I hear you say you don't have time but how many days hunting do each of you do in a year? To continue to hunt you may have to reduce the time you hunt to put time into enabling you to hunt! How much spare time will you have if you no longer hunt due to no firearms or no access to hunting country, or being allowed to shoot the current game animals. We may have a hunting heritage, but the right to hunt is not guaranteed in law. Don't think it won't or can't happen.

The time is now each and every one of you need to do your bit, sorry New Zealand will not wait until you have spare time.


