Southland Branch Report 2021

Firstly, I would like to thank all the Committee members who put in all the time behind the scenes to make everything we've achieved this year possible, looking back on the year we have ticked some pretty big boxes it's been great to be apart of.

I would also like to thank all our Guest speakers for the year we have had some great people and businesses get involved this year.

The year has not been without its challenges We begun a month later with our AGM after we got out of Covid lock Down then we faced Tharmageton and the possible destruction of one of the great game animal resources & now we face the latest round of firearms licensing reforms.

We brought the meeting time forward half an hour to try help accommodate members wanting to bring their kids along getting more involved at an earlier age, And brought in having a General meeting at before the Guest Speakers to help keep members informed and involved in events and Hunts.

In July last year we ran our first Kids Possum & rabbit hunt with great success we had 28 entry's, it was a great way to get the kids involved and bring some other branches along to

get involved as well. We were also approached by the Wyndham A&P society to run a similar event in December at the A&P show which also proved a great day out with similar numbers 29 entries on the day. Thanks to all the sponsors of these Kids hunts it's a great way to introduce kids to firearms safety and hunting.

Also, Another Stewart Island Rat programme has almost been successfully completed with 61 Rats taken 6 Cats taken (A big drop from over 1000 rats the previous season) Thanks to all the volunteers that take time off to go over and run the trap lines. And Big Thanks to INVERCARGILL HUNTING & FISHING for their ongoing support with the Rat Programme.

In September last year after a lot of background work by many club members we finally got the Rayonier's Ballot off the ground and have since been able to offer to members under Rayonier's regulations balloted access to their forestry blocks which has been great for all involved. Id like to say a special thanks to Greg from First base health & Safety for writing up the branches health and Safety plan that was a big part of getting this off the ground. Thanks to all involved.

We had a Wallaby hunting trip this year to the Hakateramia area and have another organised for June, Thar trip this May, Stewart Island trip in June. These are a great way to get out to some new areas meet some new people in a safe hunting environment. The more interest we get the more we can get organised. I know it can be quite hard to organise these in times that suit everyone, but we'll do our best. This is the second Tahr trip I've organised that I have not been able to make myself. Guess I'll just have to organise another trip...

After some rough weather Bill and his wife went up the valley to Cascade hut and spotted a fine stag near the Shotover Saddle with his telescope. He was forced to stalk up a steep corrie in snowy conditions and in full view of the stag. His injured leg did not help the situation. (Severely cut when he fell in snow on another set of antlers the previous day) Eventually he was forced to take a gamble with a very long shot – one that found it's mark. This stag is a fine example of the classic style of Otago breeding.
