As most of you no doubt know will game numbers are up on private land that has limited hunters access, and also in the remotest parts of Doc land. The Deer numbers on Deer Farms have and are in decline.

Reason the commercial markets for venison have been at best soft, sometimes sick since 2019. Venison (and other game) are restaurant meats. Due to covid world-wide people have not been eating out as much.

The Farm venison price has improved but not back to 2019 levels. Will it improve and take the price for feral game with it? Well maybe! The world is not as stable as it was then, especially in Europe! Is Europe going to have enough gas this coming winter?
