I see in the Southland Times that the Southland Conservation Board is concerned about the Deer numbers on Stewart Island. They talk of having grave concerns about the impact on the Island and call for urgent action.

Last month I spent a few days at Masons Bay, was not lucky enough to see a deer, though the party got one. But found hunting trail's overgrown and young healthy Rimu growing up unmolested.

Meanwhile Predator Free Rakiura, has got significant funding. Is employing staff, results will be expected! Is poisoning of the Island going to be back on the cards? Lacking other options being currently available.

While National Office NZDA, and the Game Animal Council, are supporting doing good things regarding Tahr, Sika and Wapiti. Where are they regarding the Whitetail on Stewart Island? Southland Branch has two Senior Life Members, doing more that their bit. Where is the support?

If wholesale poisoning of the Island were to occur how long before hunks of mainland NZ gets the same treatment. Besides which a lot of hunters love the island going by the usage the hunting blocks get.

Predator Free Rakiura Update #12

My last update was April 2021 when I advised <u>Predator Free Rakiura</u> group was given \$1m in

October 2020 and \$5 Million is on the table for the next five years. In June 2022 Manaaki Whenua (Landcare Research) added a further \$3.5k for the next four years. A Project Director and Assistant Project Director have been employed and they are looking to recruit more staff. So \$1.35m of taxpayer funds each year with the bulk to research how to eradicate cats, rats, possums & hedgehogs from the Island. Very little information is being made public but check their website..

Two articles have appeared in the media about deer on the Island. Both sourced from The Chair of Southland Conservation Board. This one in RNZ Click <u>Growing Island Deer</u> <u>Population</u>

I am unaware of any evidence of increased whitetail deer numbers on the Island. Certainly, there is plenty of evidence of the prevalence of whitetail around the village and on Rakiura Track where they are frequently encountered by trampers. Whitetail have been frequent around the village for ages and regarded as pets by some locals and are more obvious since spotlighting was ended. North Arm & Maori Beach blocks (Rakiura Track) are closed to hunting from November – March and we know how complacent whitetail get around people if they are not being shot at.

I have written to the Conservation Board trying to correct some of the inaccuracies and offering to discuss the issues but no response to date.

There is little doubt, pressures are building on our hunting heritage. Chatter will get us nowhere; we need to engage and challenge. I have been banging on for years about the value of putting in a hunter report after your Island hunt. It is very difficult to argue a case without accurate details of hunter effort on the Island. We all know the issues of sitting up till midnight to apply for a hunting block 12 months ahead. One of the local hunters has approached DoC requesting that local (resident)


hunters have "A pre time buffer for Island Hunters on the application site." How would that sit with other hunters?

From Rakiura Hunter Camp Trust

Access: Rakiura Hunter Camp Trust has written to DOC requesting Designated Helicopter Landing sites at Smoky & Upper Lords. Stewart Island Flights (fixed wing) have stopped flying to Smoky. The fine sand there is the reason and it is a hazard to helicopter turbines, At Upper Lords helicopters make the block more accessible and may reduce the double booking of the block.
